The regular meeting was called to order at 5:03 p.m. by Chair William T. C. Wood. PUBLIC COMMENT: None.

ADDRESSING CORONAVIRUS CONCERNS:

The Board and Administration discussed the Governor's order closing public schools Monday, March 16 through Friday, March 27. They reviewed the education plans for closing the school, handouts on COVID-19, and CDC considerations for school closure. Discussion included, but was not limited to, the following: Teaching staff will begin preparing packets for distance learning, following the level 2 plan for school closure (see enclosed); all activity on campus will be suspended; meals will be available to students through grab and go or delivery; hourly staff will be employed as needed, possibly in alternative duties; events like graduation, prom, FFA and FCCLA competitions will be postponed for now; state-required assessments will be pushed back; teaching staff should be available through electronic means and will develop ways to work with students to best meet their needs; the administration will communicate frequently with the Board to keep trustees updated on plans for delivering education under these circumstances. The Trustees agreed to a weekly special meeting for the duration of the school closure. Since it appears that the Governor's order includes provision for full school funding, the Trustees directed that classified employees should be put on paid administrative leave for their contracted hours.

Melissa Brummell, Madison County Public Health Department, stated that her office would be providing information to the public regarding the COVID-19 outbreak and updating people on the changing guidelines for public health and safety through the county website and Facebook page.
